



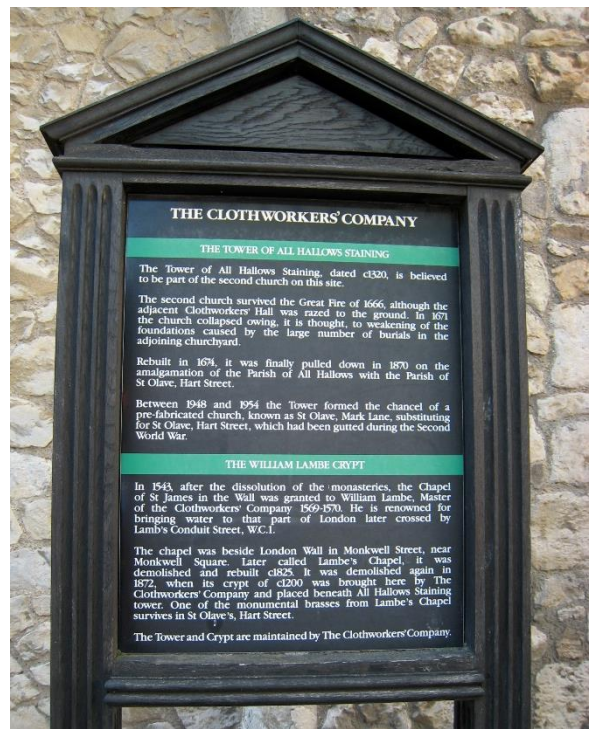
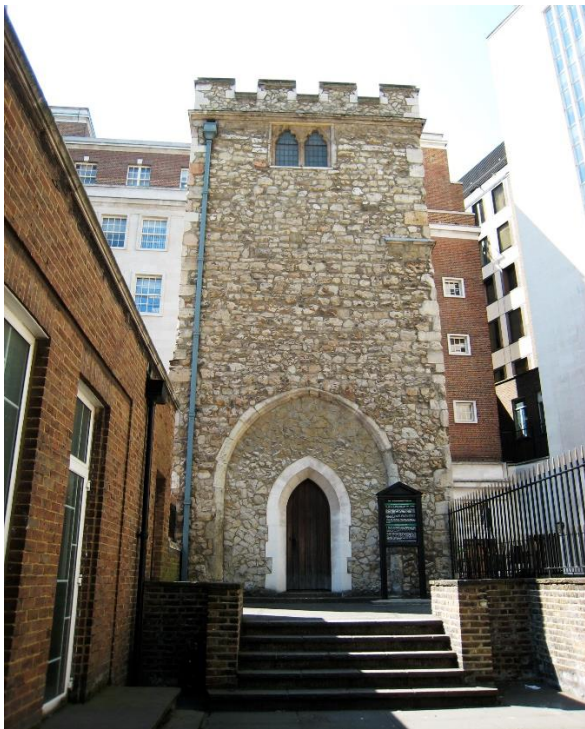

ALL HALLOWS STAINING

All Hallows Staining, Mark Lane

All Hallows, Staining, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Langbourn Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The church is first mentioned in 1177 and it survived the Great Fire only to collapse in 1671, having been undermined by too many burials. It was rebuilt but demolished in 1870 when the parish was united to that of St Olave Hart Street. The tower remains. Records of All Hallows, Staining including registers of baptisms (1642-1870), marriages (1642-1869) and burials (1653-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/ALH6.
