### St Alphage, London Wall

St Alphage, London Wall, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Cripplegate Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The earliest church was attached to the old Roman wall but after the Dissolution, the Augustinian priory was used as the parish church. The parish was united to St Mary Aldermanbury in 1917 and St Alphege church was demolished in 1923. Records of St Alphage, London Wall including registers of baptisms (1613-1920), marriages (1613-1916) and burials (1613-1851) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/ALP.
