



## ST BENET, PAUL'S WHARF

## St Benet, Paul's Wharf, Upper Thames Street

St Benet, Paul's Wharf was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Castle Baynard Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church was destroyed in the Great Fire but subsequently rebuilt by Wren. The parish then united with St Peter, Paul's Wharf, whose church had also burnt. This joint parish was united with that of St Nicholas Cole Abbey in 1879, at which point it became the London church of the Welsh Episcopalians. Records of St Benet Paul's Wharf, including registers of baptisms (1619-1931), marriages (1619-1879) and burials (1619-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/BEN3.
