ST DUNSTAN IN THE EAST

St Dunstan in the East, Idol Lane

St Dunstan in the East was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Tower Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church was built in the 13th century. Most of it survived the Great Fire but Wren rebuilt the tower and steeple. Most of the church was destroyed by bombing in the Second World War and the tower and nave walls are now a garden. The parish was united to All Hallows Barking in 1960. Records of St Dunstan in the East, including registers of baptisms (1558-1948), marriages (1558-1939) and burials (1558-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/DUN1.
