ST GILES WITHOUT CRIPPLEGATE

St Giles without Cripplegate, Fore Street

St Giles without Cripplegate was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Cripplegate Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

Founded in the 11th century, this church was rebuilt in the 16th century and again in the 1950s, having been extensively damaged during the Second World War. In 1954 it was united with the joined parishes of St Alphage London Wall and St Mary Aldermanbury. Records of St Giles without Cripplegate including registers of baptisms (1561-1961), marriages (1561-2000) and burials (1561-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/GIS.
