



St Margaret, Lothbury

St Margaret, Lothbury, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Coleman Street Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The church of St Margaret Lothbury was first mentioned in the 12th century. It was destroyed in the Great Fire and was rebuilt in 1690. The parish was united to that of St Christopher le Stocks in 1781 when the church was demolished. In 1839 St Bartholomew by the Exchange was added when its church was also demolished, with St Martin Pomeroy, St Mary Colechurch, St Olave Jewry and St Mildred Poultry added in 1886. Records of St Margaret Lothbury including registers of baptisms (1558-1924), marriages (1558-1996) and burials (1558-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/MGT1.
