ST MARY SOMERSET

St Mary Somerset, Upper Thames Street

St Mary Somerset was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Queenhithe Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church dated to the 12th century but was destroyed in the Great Fire. It was rebuilt by Wren and the parish then united with St Mary Mounthaw. St Mary Somerset (all but the tower) was demolished in 1872 when the parish joined that of St Nicholas Cole Abbey. Records of St Mary Somerset, including registers of baptisms (1558-1880), marriages (1558-1755) and burials (1558-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/MRY12.
