



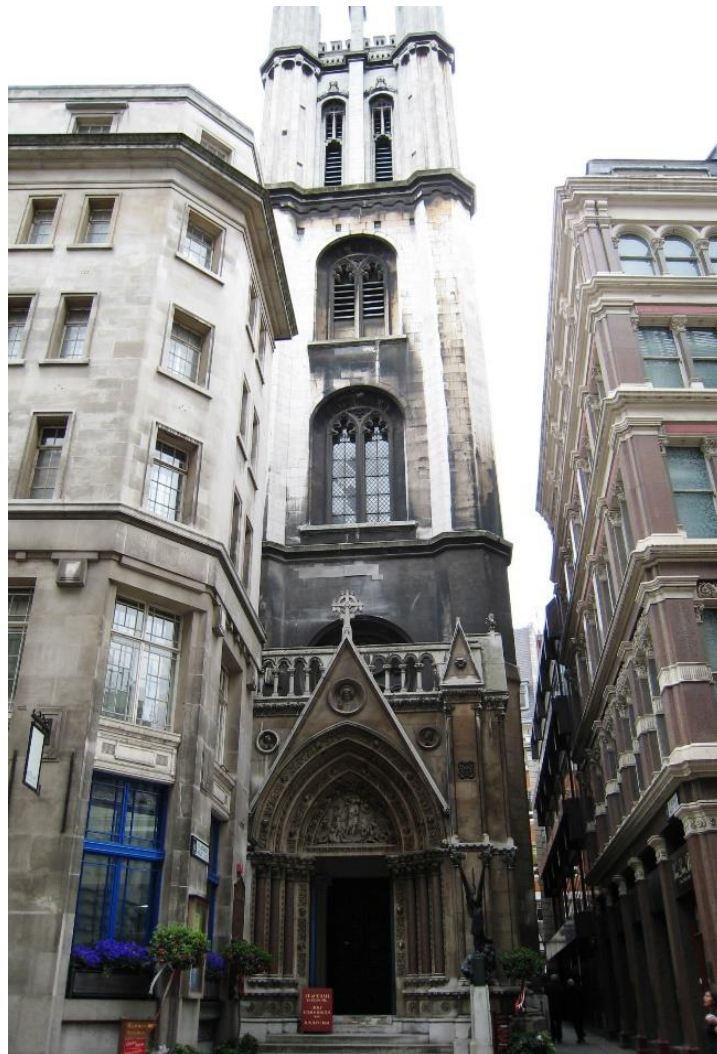

St Michael, Cornhill

St Michael, Cornhill, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Cornhill Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church first appears in the records in 1055. It was destroyed in the Great Fire of 1666 but was rebuilt by Wren. The parish was united to the parishes of St Benet Fink and St Peter le Poer in 1906. Records of St Michael, Cornhill including registers of baptisms (1546-1986), marriages (1546-1836) and burials (1536-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/MIC2.
