St Olave, Hart Street

St Olave, Hart Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Tower Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

St Olave was named after King Olaf of Norway and built soon after he died in 1025. It was rebuilt in the 13th and 15th centuries and restored in the 20th. The parish of All Hallows Staining was united to this parish in 1870 and in 1921 St Katherine Coleman was joined to them. Records of St Olave Hart Street, including registers of baptisms (1563-1978), marriages (1563-1961) and burials (1563-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/OLA1.
