St Peter, Cornhill

St Peter, Cornhill was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Cornhill Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

St Peter's is an ancient site of Christian worship in the City. The church was burnt down in the Great Fire but a new one was subsequently constructed by Christopher Wren. Its churchyard, to the south of the church, remains a public garden. Records of St Peter, Cornhill including registers of baptisms (1538-1951), marriages (1539-1985) and burials (1539-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/PET1.
