ST VEDAST

St Vedast, Foster Lane

St Vedast, Foster Lane, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Farringdon Within Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church was rebuilt in 1519 and then again after the Great Fire. Following the Second World War it had to be restored and it was fitted out with pieces from other damaged churches. A register of baptisms, marriages and burials 1538-1812 (marriages with St Peter Westcheap c. 1699) formerly held at St Vedast's Foster Lane c.1933, was destroyed by enemy action in 1940. Records of St Vedast including registers of marriages (1754-1981) and burials (1813-1853) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/VED.
