All Hallows, Lombard Street

All Hallows, Lombard Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Langbourn Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This parish was first mentioned in documents in 1053. The church was rebuilt around 1500, burnt down in the Great Fire of 1666 and was then rebuilt by Sir Christopher Wren. The church was closed in 1937, the site sold and the building demolished. The tower survived, however, and was reconstructed at All Hallows, Chertsey Road, Twickenham. The parish was united with the joined parishes of St Benet Gracechurch and St Leonard Eastcheap in 1864. St Dionis Backchurch joined them in 1876. Records of All Hallows, Lombard Street including registers of baptisms (1550-1937), marriages (1553-1937) and burials (1549-1853) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/ALH4.
