ALL HALLOWS THE GREAT

All Hallows the Great, Upper Thames Street

All Hallows the Great was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Dowgate Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

Also known as All Hallows in the Ropery/ in La Corderie/ at the Hay, this church was first mentioned in 1235. It was rebuilt in the 1620s but burnt down in the Great Fire. Wren designed a new church but most of this was demolished in 1876 to widen Queen Victoria Street and in 1893 the parish was united with St Michael Paternoster Royal. The remains of the church were bombed in 1939. Mondial House was built on the site of the churchyard in 1969. Records of All Hallows the Great including registers of baptisms (1668-1823), marriages (1671-1890) and burials (1666-1853) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/ALH7.
