HOLY TRINITY THE LESS

Holy Trinity the Less, Knightrider Street

Holy Trinity the Less, Knightrider Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Queenhithe Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

First mentioned in 1258, this church was rebuilt in 1607 but was destroyed in the Great Fire. Merchants built a German church on the site and the parish was united with St Michael Queenhithe in 1670 and then with St James Garlickhythe in 1875. Records of Holy Trinity the Less including registers of baptisms (1547-1851), marriages (1547-1830) and burials (1547-1852) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/TRI3.

Mansion House underground station was built on the site of the church and churchyard.
