



ST BARTHOLOMEW BY THE EXCHANGE

St Bartholomew by the Exchange, Bartholomew Street

St Bartholomew by the Exchange was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Broad Street Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

St Bartholomew was mentioned in documents in 1150. It burnt down in the Great Fire in 1666 and was rebuilt by Christopher Wren in the 1670s. The church was demolished in 1840 to make room for the new Royal Exchange and the parish united with that of St Margaret Lothbury.
