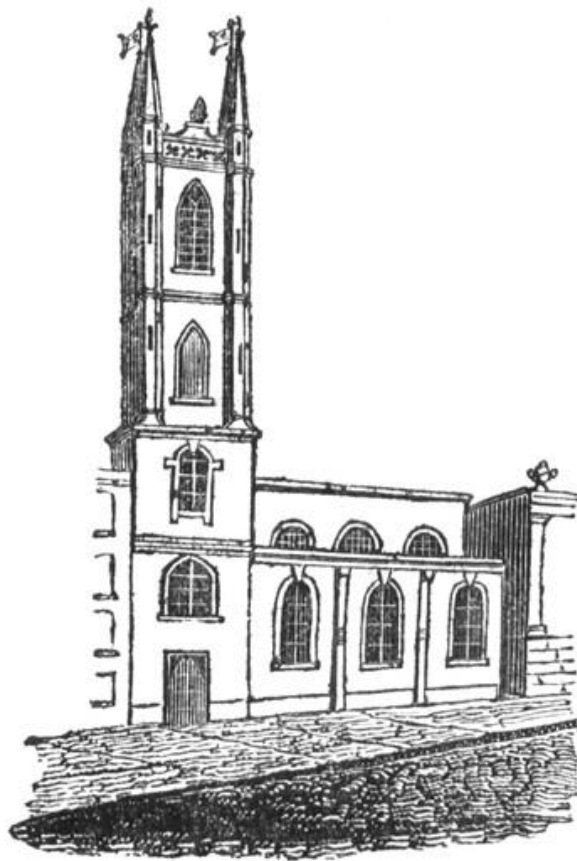
ST CHRISTOPHER LE STOCKS

St Christopher le Stocks, Threadneedle Street

St Christopher le Stocks was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Broad Street Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church was built on the banks of the Walbrook stream at some point before 1225 and was named after the Stocks Market nearby. It was damaged in the Great Fire but repaired by Wren in 1670. The building was demolished in 1781 and the Dividend Warrant Office built on the site. At this point the parish was united to St Margaret Lothbury.
