



ST DIONIS BACKCHURCH

St Dionis Backchurch, Lime Street

St Dionis Backchurch was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Langbourn Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The church was recorded first in 1098 but was destroyed by the Great Fire. It was rebuilt by Wren but was demolished in 1878. In 1876 the parish was united with All Hallows Lombard Street, St Benet Gracechurch and St Leonard Eastcheap and all of these then joined the united parishes of St Edmund the King and Martyr and St Nicholas Acons in 1937.
