



ST MARTIN OUTWICH

St Martin Outwich, Threadneedle Street

St Martin Outwich was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Broad Street Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The church was rebuilt in 1403 and was not damaged in the Great Fire but burnt down in a later fire in 1765. A new church was built in 1798 on the site of the previous one at junction of Threadneedle Street and Bishopsgate. This was demolished in 1874 and the parish united with St Helen Bishopsgate. Records of St Martin Outwich, including registers of baptisms (1670-1873), marriages (1670-1872) and burials (1670-1819) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/MTN3.
