St Mary, Aldermanbury

St Mary, Aldermanbury, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Cripplegate Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church was destroyed in the Great Fire and then again in the Second World War. The ruins can now be seen at Fulton, Missouri, USA, where they form a memorial to Winston Churchill. The parish united with St Alphage London Wall in 1954. Records of St Mary, Aldermanbury including registers of baptisms (1538-1940), marriages (1538-1754 and 1791-1940) and burials (1538-1859) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/MRY2.



The site of St Mary Aldermanbury is now a City garden by Guildhall Library.

The garden contains this monument to Henry Condell and John Heminges who were involved in the First Folio of William Shakespeare's plays and also the Globe Theatre. They lived in the parish and were buried in the churchyard.
