



St Matthew, Friday Street

St Matthew, Friday Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Farringdon Within Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church burnt down in the Great Fire and was rebuilt by Wren before demolition in 1881. The parish joined that of St Vedast Foster Lane. Records of St Matthew Friday Street including registers of baptisms (1813-1882), marriages (1814-1836) and burials (1813-1846) are at London Metropolitan Archives, Ref: P69/MTW. A transcription of earlier registers dated 1538-1812 is also available at the London Archives.
