



ST MICHAEL QUEENHITHE

St Michael Queenhithe, Upper Thames Street

St Michael Queenhithe was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Queenhithe Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The Great Fire also destroyed this church but it was rebuilt by Wren in 1676. Its parish was united to Holy Trinity the Less, which had also burnt down, in 1670. These joint parishes were united to St James Garlickhithe in 1875 and St Michael Queenhithe was then demolished. Records of St Michael Queenhithe, including registers of baptisms (1653-1876), marriages (1653-1875) and burials (1653-1852) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/MIC6.
