



St Michael, Wood Street

St Michael, Wood Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Cripplegate Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church is first mentioned in records in 1170. It was destroyed in the Great Fire but rebuilt by Christopher Wren in the 1670s. The parish was later united with that of St Alban Wood Street and St Michael was demolished in 1894. Records of St Michael, Wood Street including registers of baptisms (1559-1662), marriages (1559-1661 and 1754-1815) and burials (1559-1659 and 1678-1812) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/MIC7.
