
ST MILDRED BREAD STREET

St Mildred, Bread Street

St Mildred Bread Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Bread Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

The church of St Mildred was built before 1252 but burnt down in 1666. The parish joined with that of St Margaret Moses, whose church also burnt, in 1670. St Mildred's was rebuilt by Wren but this building was destroyed by bombing in the Second World War. The joint parishes then united to St Mary le Bow.
