ST PETER PAUL'S WHARF

St Peter Paul's Wharf, Upper Thames Street

St Peter, Paul's Wharf was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Queenhithe Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church is mentioned in 1170 but it was destroyed by the Great Fire, after which its parish was united with that of St Benet, Paul's Wharf. Records of St Peter, Paul's Wharf including registers of baptisms (1607-1886), marriages (1607-1684 and 1828-1834) and burials (1607-1849) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/PET3.

During the English Civil War (1642-1651), the parish was defiant and continued to use the Book of Common Prayer.
