## St Stephen Coleman Street

St Stephen Coleman Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Coleman Street Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church, which was situated on the junction with Gresham Street, was also known as St Stephen Jewry in medieval times. The church was destroyed twice, once during the Great Fire and then again in the Second World War. It was not rebuilt and the parish united with St Margaret Lothbury in 1954. Records of St Stephen, Coleman Street including registers of baptisms (1538-1951), marriages (1538-1952) and burials (1538-1853) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/STE1.
