ST THOMAS APOSTLE

St Thomas Apostle, Queen Street

St Thomas Apostle, Queen Street, was an ancient parish in the City of London and formed part of Vintry Ward. Each ward has an elected alderman and supporting councilmen in the City of London Corporation which has administered the City since before the Norman Conquest and is still doing so today.

This church first appears in records in 1170. It burnt down in 1666 and the parish was then united with that of St Mary Aldermanbury. Records of St Thomas the Apostle, including registers of baptisms (1558-1680 and 1704-1873), marriages (1558-1672 and 1754-1869) and burials (1558-1680 and 1704-1849) are at The London Archives, Ref: P69/TMS1.
